	Spirit Have a patrol flag and rally around it. Put your patrol design on your patrol equipment. Use your yell or cheer and patrol call. Keep patrol records up to date for the three months.
	Patrol Meetings Hold two patrol meetings each month for three months.
	Hikes, outdoor activities, and other events Take part in one of these within three months. This must be an activity only for the members of your patrol which your patrol has totally planned. Going on a troop outing as a patrol does not count.
	Good turns or service projects Do two Patrol Leaders' Council approved Good Turns or service projects within the three months. Again, a Good Turn or Service Project which is a troop activity does not count, even though your patrol does it as a patrol. The United Food and Clothing Drive, for example, would not count.
	Advancement One half or more of the membership of your patrol must earn advancement during the three month period. An advancement would be either advancing a rank or earing a merit badge. Thus, if you have 7 members in your patrol, 4 of them must

advance. For instance, two of them might earn a merit badge and two might advance a rank.
 Membership Venture patrols are exempt from this requirement. Other patrols with less than eight members must add one new scout during the three month period until the patrol has 8 members. The two Wolverine patrols will be considered as two separate patrols for this requirement.
Uniform The troop scribe will keep a record of everyone in the troop attending and those who are wearing the uniform. During the fall, winter and spring, the khaki dress shirt must be worn to qualify at troop meetings. During the summer, a Boy Scout T-shirt of some sort or the Khaki shirt must be worn. Venture patrols may wear their maroon shirt anytime of the year. To qualify for this requirement, 67% of the members on the average through the three months must be in uniform. For example, if your patrol has 7 members, and on the average 5 attend each meeting during the 12 meetings, then the total scout-days = 60. 67% of 60 is 40. The scouts in your patrol must wear the uniform 40 of the 60 opportunities to come to a meeting in uniform.
 Patrol Leaders' Council Your patrol must have a representative Scout (not adult) present at each and every PLC meeting during the three month period. That representative should be the PL. If he cannot attend, then the APL. If he cannot attend, then some other patrol member must be there. No excuses.

If your patrol earns the Baden-Powell Award, then your patrol will be taken out for gobs of ice cream and each patrol member will receive a Baden-Powell star to put around the edge of the patrol medallion.
